Submission of Manuscripts

The entire submission and review process for *Social Political Economic and Cultural Research* is handled electronically, which shortens publication times. Authors can be submitted word and pdf files of their manuscripts by online to Editor-in-Chief (E-mail: ayhandemirbas@hotmail.com). Although this journal is international in scope, all articles must be in the English language. Potential contributors whose first language is not English are urged to have their manuscript competently edited prior to submission. Papers should be written in the third person in an objective, formal and impersonal style.

Manuscript Preparation:

Please use Word and PDF files for the text of your manuscript. Follow this order when typing manuscripts: Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text, References, Appendix, Tables (each on a separate sheet), Captions to Illustrations (on a separate sheet) and then Illustrations (each on a separate sheet containing no text). Manuscripts must be typed in single column format on one side only of International Standard Size A4 paper, with a left-hand margin of 40 mm. The text should be double-spaced. Number every sheet. Line numbering should be re-started on each page.

Clearly indicate who is responsible for correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication, including post-publication. Ensure that telephone and fax numbers (with country and area code) are provided in addition to the e-mail address and the complete postal address. Full postal addresses must be given for all co-authors.

A self-contained abstract of up to 150 to 200 words outlining in a single paragraph the aims, scope and conclusions of the paper must be supplied; acknowledgements (if any); article title abbreviated appropriately for use as a running headline. Immediately after the abstract, provide a maximum of seven keywords (avoid, for example, 'and', 'of'). Be sparing with abbreviations: only abbreviations firmly established in the field may be eligible.

Units: Follow internationally accepted rules and conventions: use the international system of units (SI). If other quantities are mentioned, give their equivalent in SI.

References and Footnotes: All publications cited in the text should be presented in a list of references following the text of the manuscript.

Text: All citations in the text should refer to:

1. Single author: the author's name (without initials, unless there is ambiguity) and the year of publication;
2. Two authors: both authors' names and the year of publication;
3. Three or more authors: first author's name followed by 'et al.' and the year of publication. Citations may be made directly (or parenthetically). Groups of references should be listed first alphabetically, then chronologically.

Examples: "as demonstrated (Balat, 2008a, 2008b, 2009; Demirbas and Balat, 2006). Demirbas et al. (2008) have recently shown"

List: References should be arranged first alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically if necessary. More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters "a", "b", "c", etc., placed after the year of publication. Full journal titles should be used.

Examples:

Reference to a journal paper: Lee, M.R., Hayes, T.C., Thomas, S.A. 2008. Regional variation in the effect of structural factors on homicide in rural areas. *Soc Sci J* 45:76–94.

Reference to books: Strunk Jr., W., White, E.B. 1979. *The Elements of Style*, third ed. Macmillan, New York. Smith, C., Denton, M.L. 2005. *Soul Searching: The Religious and Spiritual Lives of American Teenagers*. Oxford University Press, New York.

Reference to a chapter in an edited book: Mettam, G.R., Adams, L.B. 1999. How to prepare an electronic version of your article, in: Jones, B.S., Smith, R.Z. (Eds.), *Introduction to the Electronic Age*. E-Publishing Inc., New York, pp. 281-304.

Illustrations: All illustrations should be provided in camera-ready form, suitable for reproduction (which may include reduction) without retouching. Photographs, charts and diagrams are all to be referred to as "Fig(s)" and should be numbered consecutively in the order to which they are referred. They should be accompany the manuscript, but should not be included within the text.

Tables: Tables should be numbered consecutively and given a suitable caption and each table typed on a separate sheet. Footnotes to tables should be typed below the table and should be referred to by superscript lowercase letters.

Copyright

Papers are considered for publication on the understanding that they have not been submitted to any other publisher. With the exception of review papers, the work described must be original and, generally speaking, not previously published. Authors who wish to reproduce illustrations that have been published elsewhere must obtain the permission of the copyright holder.
